Students will gain skills and knowledge to confidently and safely work with animals while studying at Landsdale Farm

Course overview

Duration: One semester Attendance: 1 day per week Intake: Tuesday 11 February 2025 -Tuesday 24 June 2025 Where: Landsdale Farm, Darch WA



Best suited to: Years 10 – 12 high school aged students who are passionate about a career working with animals

Course fees: This program is a Jobs and Skills WA VETDSS funded course, as such eligible students are exempt from course and resource fees*

Practical training & course structure

Workplace learning will be undertaken at Landsdale Farm. Students will:

- Gain hands-on skills working with a range of companion and farm animals.
- Train in a nurturing environment alongside other like-minded high school students.
- Be in a safe environment supervised by AVT Trainer and Assessors who have working with children checks.

This course been assessed as appropriate for inclusion on the Department of Training and Workforce Development's VET delivered to Secondary Schools funded list 2024.

Over one semester, students participate in weekly classroom and practical training sessions at Landsdale Farm in Darch WA. In months 1-2, students learn workplace safety in the animal care industry and the fundamentals of handling and approaching animals. In months 3-4, students learn about caring for animals, feeding practices, first aid, and animal behaviour. In the final months, students consolidate theory and practical skills to become work ready.

Students will not be required to find a work placement for additional training/experience.

What to expect?

Essential Requirements

Throughout this course, students will need to:

- Collaborate in group settings using both verbal and non-verbal communication.
- Effectively communicate with peers and Trainer and Assessor.
- Follow written and verbal instructions accurately.
- Engage in group activities and practical assessments alongside peers.
- Complete workplace documentation using industryspecific language.
- Wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including steel toe-capped boots, gloves and sun protection.
- Work within an animal care facility, handling and caring for various species. This environment by its nature will expose students to potential allergens.
- Adhere to hygiene protocols to ensure animal health, which may involve contact with animal waste such as uneaten food, urine, faeces, soiled bedding and enrichment items.

Environmental Requirements

In this course, students will:

- Attend classes with a maximum of 24 students.
- Work outdoors, exposed to various weather conditions.
- Encounter moderate levels of noise, including animal sounds, the general public and farm machinery.
- Be physically capable of lifting equipment, and standing or walking for extended periods.

Assessment Types

Students will be assessed on their skills and knowledge in various ways, including:

• Written answers, online assessments and tests, multiple choice questions, presentations, verbal questioning and practical tasks visually assessed by Trainer and Assessors.

Entry requirements

Students will need to:

- Have a reliable internet connection and laptop
- Hold C Grades in 10 English and Maths or equivalent
- Be physically capable of restraining animals, handling animal feed e.g. large bags of food of up to 10kg and standing for extended periods of time

Compulsory uniform

We want to ensure students won't be afraid to get a little messy whilst participating in hands-on training. That's why students will wear a uniform on-site each week including:

- AVT shirt and name badge (provided)
- Black long pants and hat (supplied by student)
- Steel-capped shoes (supplied by student)
